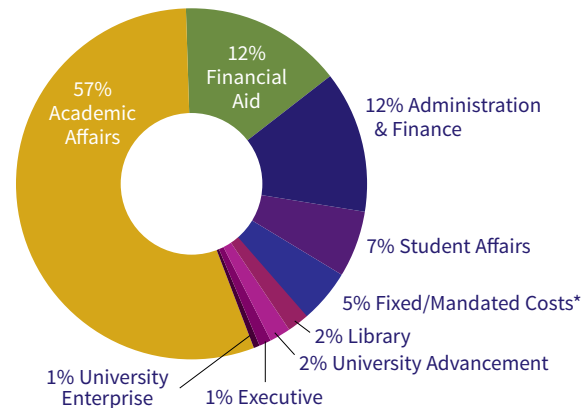
2018-2019 BUDGET
